

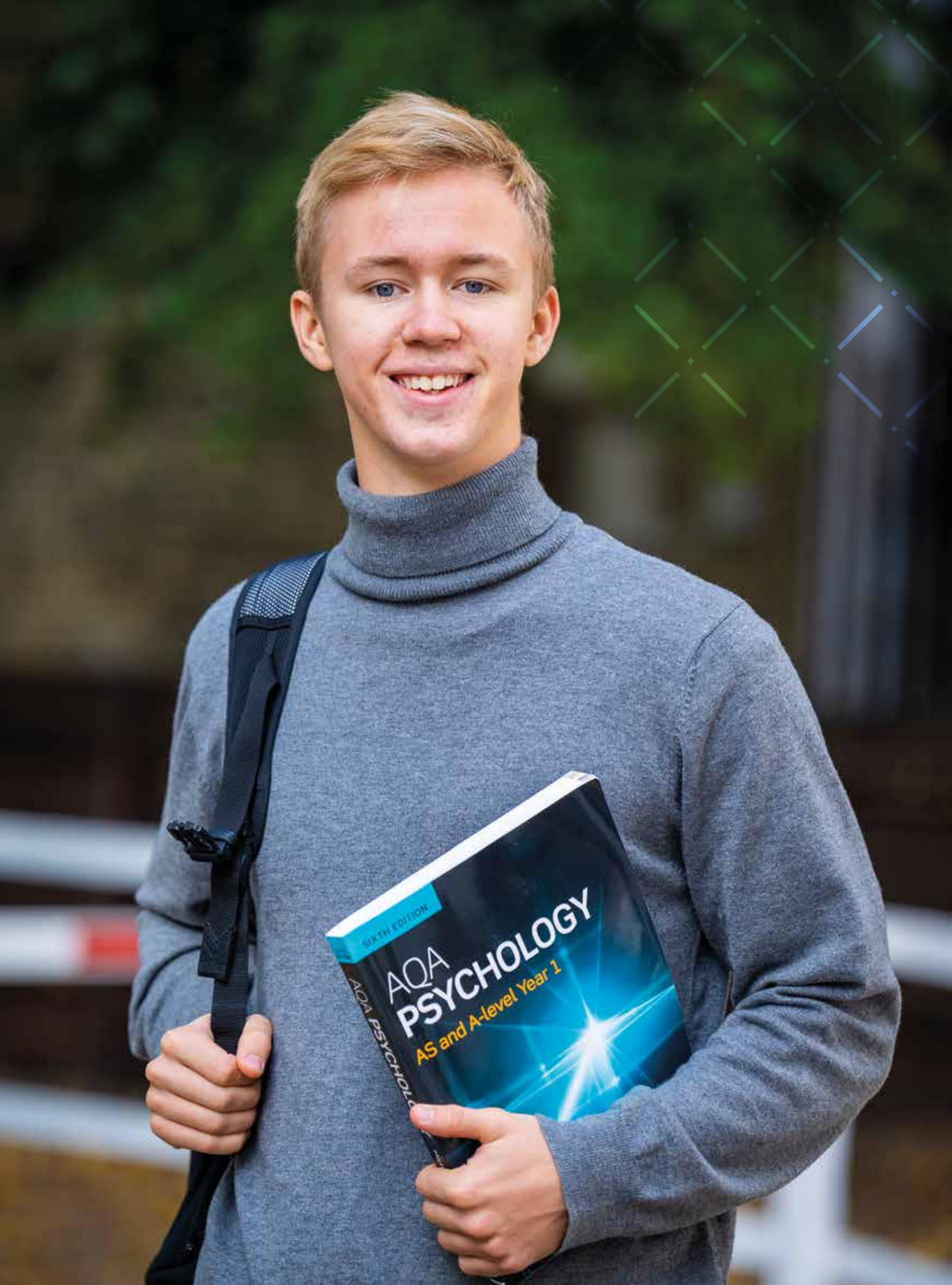

UNIVERSITY FOUNDATION COURSES

Why choose a Foundation course?

- A fast and cost-effective route to university for students aged over 16.5 years
- 1 or 2 year options (September start)
- 6 or 18 months options (January start)
- Wide range of subject options
- Weekly personal tutor support
- Designed with international students in mind. There is a higher pass rate for international students on foundation courses than for those doing A-Levels
- Students who may not have succeeded at A-Levels are often successful on a Foundation course
- IELTS preparation built in to ensure students meet IELTS entry requirements for their chosen university
- Not tied to a specific university.
- In 2023 87% of our students were offered places at Russell Group universities and 100% of our students gained places at a UK university
- Over 80% of the Russell group universities accept foundation courses
- Smaller class sizes to ensure individual attention to maximise results rather than the large-scale university foundation courses where students often get lost
- A boarding school environment with excellent academic support and pastoral care – ideal for those away from home for the first time
- University preparation classes with extensive UCAS support and advice on university options available from experienced personal tutors
- Accredited by NCFE and internally assessed

ENGLISH LANGUAGE & SKILLS

A significant part of helping our students prepare for university is focused on developing their level of English.

Students take EAP/Advanced English classes to expand their knowledge of the language.

The number of classes required per week to achieve this goal is based on a student's IELTS entry level. IELTS classes focus on developing strategies for all parts of the test (reading, writing, listening, speaking).

Students develop grammar a range of vocabulary including academic terminology, improve their writing styles, gain confidence in speaking and improve their English listening skills.

Monitoring Progress

- Students tested on arrival in September and every half term
- Regular in-class progress tests
- Additional support offered to those experiencing difficulties
- Homework set in preparation for lessons and to practice what has been covered during class
- Students supported in identifying what they need to focus on in their self-study
- Monthly speakers (business and industry, university statements, careers etc)

PASTORAL CARE

At St Andrew's we take the care of our students very seriously, ensuring that they are happy and healthy in order to be able to study effectively and enjoy their time with us.

Every one of our students is unique and require different levels of support at varying times. Our pastoral care has been rated as good and we take pride in the levels of attention, care and support that we can give our students.

Our team of House Parents and personal tutors, who meet with students weekly led by our Deputy Head (Boarding & Pastoral Care), are here to support our students wellbeing and are available anytime to talk to individual students and indeed parents about any concerns.

- Collects medical information prior to enrolment and passes this to House Parents and other staff so they can care for students effectively
- Register students with our GP in Cambridge so they can access free medical care
- Books medical, dental, optician or counselling appointments for students
- Attends appointments with students if required
- Provides advice and guidance to students about medical and other services in Cambridge
- Is available for students to talk to, at any time, if they have problems (e.g. homesickness, stress)
- Liaises with teaching staff regarding support for students who have medical or other needs, e.g. timetable adjustments, one-to-one support
- Holds regular student wellbeing champion sessions
- Sends students a weekly wellbeing questionnaire
- Sends monthly newsletters informing students about topics relating to health and well-being
- School Medical Centre open Monday - Friday
- Counselling services available





STUDENT VOICE / STUDENT COUNCIL

The student voice is a small group of students that are there to support students and voice concerns or queries with the senior leadership team.

- Help develop positive school environment
- Ensure every student's voice is heard
- Student's opinions are collected via questionnaires & through verbal feedback

The student council is made up of a group of students who have been appointed following a successful application and interview process to become part of the council.

- The student council are responsible for helping organise different events throughout the year, for example the graduation ball and sports competitions.
- The student council are passionate about their school and their education.
- The council's role also includes supporting the delivery of whole school assemblies and the promotion of student events.
- The student council members each have an area they are responsible for which includes media, events, culture and charity.
- They encourage students to provide feedback at numerous points over the year which is then used to inform future planning and opportunities.





ACCOMMODATION

St Andrew's has seven boarding houses, all with dedicated House Parents, who live in the house with the students and take care of everything they need.

As well as providing excellent care, support and a listening ear for students, our House Parents provide breakfast, take care of student's laundry and clean their rooms.

We want our students to enjoy a "home away from home" environment in smaller boarding houses than traditional boarding schools so that we can really focus on our students' needs help with any issues as well as celebrate their achievements just like home.

Located in the heart of Cambridge, close to the school and local attractions, our smallest residence accommodates just eight students, whilst our largest houses 29.

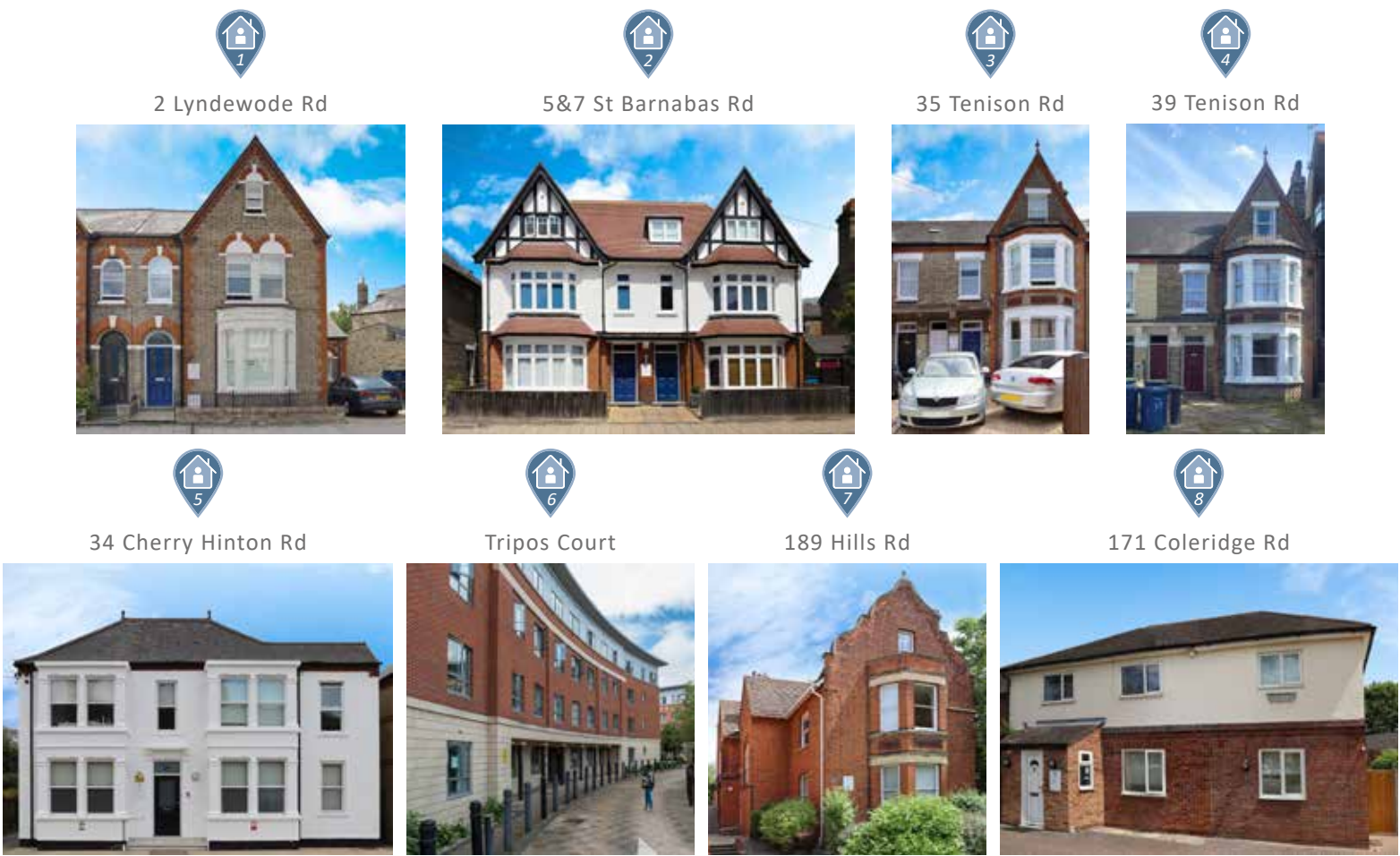
- Ensure a comfortable family environment

All boarding houses have communal spaces where students eat breakfast & relax with their housemates.

Students live in twin or single rooms, most of which are ensuite. We pride ourselves on having quality residential accommodation for our students which provides them with a comfortable and caring family environment in which they can study and call home.

CANTEEN

In January 2023, St Andrew's officially opened our new canteen on Glisson Road where we offer our students and staff lunch and dinner seven days a week.

The chef manager creates a new menu each term that rotates over a three-week period. In addition to all the meat being halal, the canteen also caters to any and all dietary requirements and includes a vegetarian option with meal.

The application is reviewed and you will be made an offer. To accept the offer, please fill in and return the acceptance and parental consent forms and pay the deposit within one week.



Pre-arrival paper work including medical, guardianship (students under 18) and travel forms are sent out and must be completed and returned along with the first term's fees paid in full.



Confirmation of Acceptance of Studies (CAS) is generated

Students below the age of 18 can choose to take the St Andrew's English entry test, based on similar criteria to IELTS, to be eligible for both a place and/or a scholarship.

The scholarship policy applies to Pre A-level / GCSE, A-level and Foundation courses for both September and January intake.

Scholarships are offered to the student for the whole duration of study at St Andrew's. However, scholarships are reviewed annually and are subject to good performance and behaviour and scholars are expected to help represent the college. To obtain a continuation of the scholarship a student would need at least AAB in the first year of A-level and an attendance level of at least 95% in all subjects.

If taking a course or subjects for A Level that does not include Maths, the Maths test is not taken into consideration. The student may need to present a portfolio/essay for review instead.

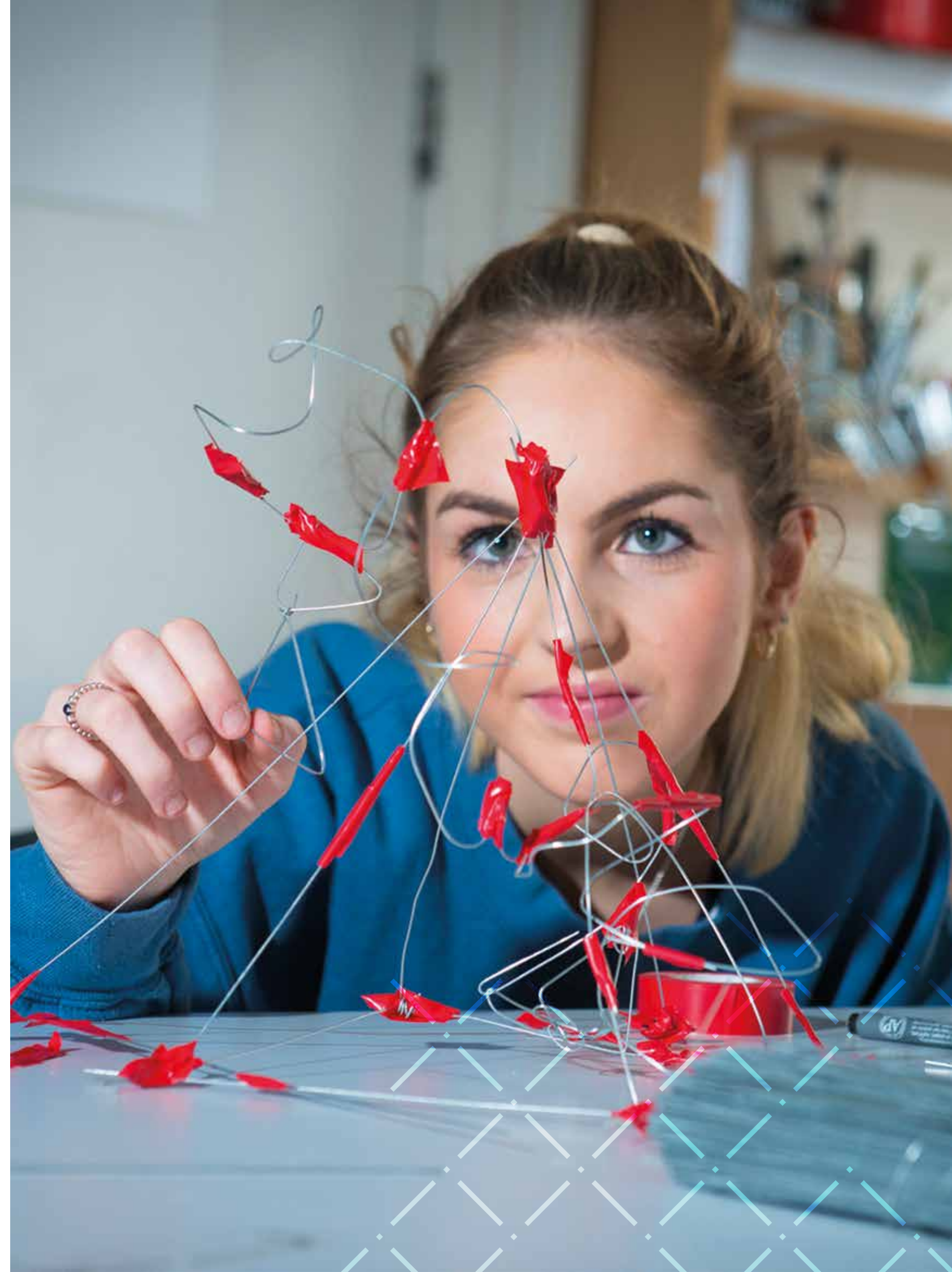
