Designed for students who are non-native English speakers, this comprehensive programme runs from September to June, providing continuous support throughout the academic year.

Whether you're preparing for the demands of university-level coursework or seeking to improve your language skills in a more focused academic context, our EAP programme offers the tools and guidance necessary for success.







EAP Programme Overview

Duration:

September – June (over 150 hours tuition)

Cost:

£3600 per year- which also includes:

- Two core EAP textbooks selected by level and academic needs
- Mock Test conducted with a qualified examiner to benchmark progress throughout the year
- Formative Assessment used to identify areas for targeted support and to simulate exam conditions
- IELTS Exam Fees (for test takers)







Focus Areas

English Language Support

Our programme builds a strong foundation in the four core language skills essential for academic success. Through engaging, age-appropriate materials and classroom discussion, students improve their ability to understand complex texts, express themselves clearly in writing, participate in academic conversations, and listen critically. These skills are vital for success in all subject areas.

<u>Developing Academic</u> Research Skills

Beyond language proficiency, we prioritise the development of independent thinking. Students learn how to evaluate sources, form evidence-based opinions, and communicate ideas effectively.

These analytical skills not only strengthen academic performance but also prepare learners to thrive in future educational and professional environments.

An IELTS preparation course is designed to help students meet the English language requirements for university admission. It focuses on developing key academic skills aligned with the IELTS test format.

Through targeted practice, test strategies, and feedback, students improve their language proficiency and build the confidence needed to achieve the required band scores for entry into higher education institutions.





EnglishLanguage Support

An English Language Support plan provides targeted assistance to help students succeed academically and socially in an international college setting.

It offers personalised resources and guidance to strengthen skills in reading, writing, listening, and speaking, ensuring students can fully engage with course content and participate in classroom discussions.

The personalised plan may include language workshops, tutoring, conversation groups, and access to academic writing support.

By addressing individual language needs, the support plan helps students build confidence, overcome language barriers, and integrate more smoothly into the college community.

Study support and mentoring:

All students are paired with a peer tutor to review subject content, practise academic skills, and build confidence together.

This collaborative support is complemented by access to one-on-one mentoring from teachers throughout the year.

Subject specific language input:

Our EAP team works closely with students to strengthen their use of subject-specific vocabulary and improve the structure of their written and spoken responses, ensuring they meet the expectations of academic study in every discipline.

Developing Academic Research Skills

Academic research skills are essential for success in higher education and beyond. Our programme equips students with the ability to investigate topics independently, gather and evaluate credible sources, and present their findings in a structured, evidence-based format.

Through this training, students become confident, critical thinkers who can approach complex issues methodically and ethically. We use a scaffolded, step-by-step approach to research skill development.

Students begin by learning how to form focused research questions and identify reliable academic sources. They are taught how to take effective notes, organise information, and avoid plagiarism through proper referencing.

Tasks include guided literature reviews, research logbooks, annotated bibliographies, and small-scale inquiry projects. For students undertaking the EPQ or similar projects, we provide individual mentoring to support research design, data interpretation, and academic writing.








Language Entry Requirements For University Admissions

The IELTS (International English Language Testing System) is important for university admissions because it provides a standardised measure of English language proficiency for non-native speakers.

Many universities, especially in English-speaking countries, require IELTS scores to ensure students can understand lectures, participate in discussions, and complete assignments effectively. A strong IELTS score demonstrates readiness for academic success.

Minimum Required	University
7 - 7.5	Oxford and Cambridge University, Imperial College London, LSE
6.5 - 7	KCL, Queen Mary London, Bristol
6 - 6.5	Most of Russell Group Universities and UAL, Goldsmith, Royal Holloway
5.5 - 6	Most other UK universities

International students are expected to meet both language and academic requirements when applying to university. It's important to carefully review your full offer to ensure you understand what's needed for your chosen course.
