Designed for international students, the Foundation Programme provides a direct pathway to leading UK universities while offering personalised academic support and a fully integrated Cambridge experience. Divided into three broad faculties of Art, Humanities and Science, students study at least three subjects. Options also include core subjects such as Mathematics, Chemistry and Psychology and Psychology can be approached from either a scientific or a humanities perspective.

English for Academic Purposes

Recommended for all students with an IELTS score below 6.5 and compulsory for A-Level and University Foundation students with an IELTS score below 6.0.

Six hours of teaching per week, four hours of specific IELTS preparation and two hours of advanced grammar and vocabulary.

English Language support to help students understand complex texts, express themselves clearly in writing, participate in academic conversations and listen critically.

Develop academic research skills, independent thinking, evaluation of sources, form evidence-based opinions and communicate ideas effectively.

Conducted via language workshops, tutoring (individual and group), conversation groups and academic writing support.

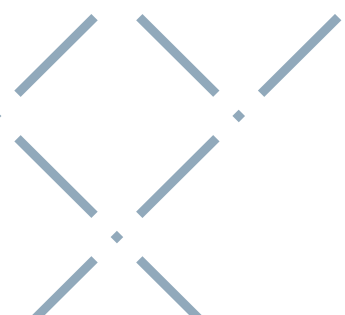

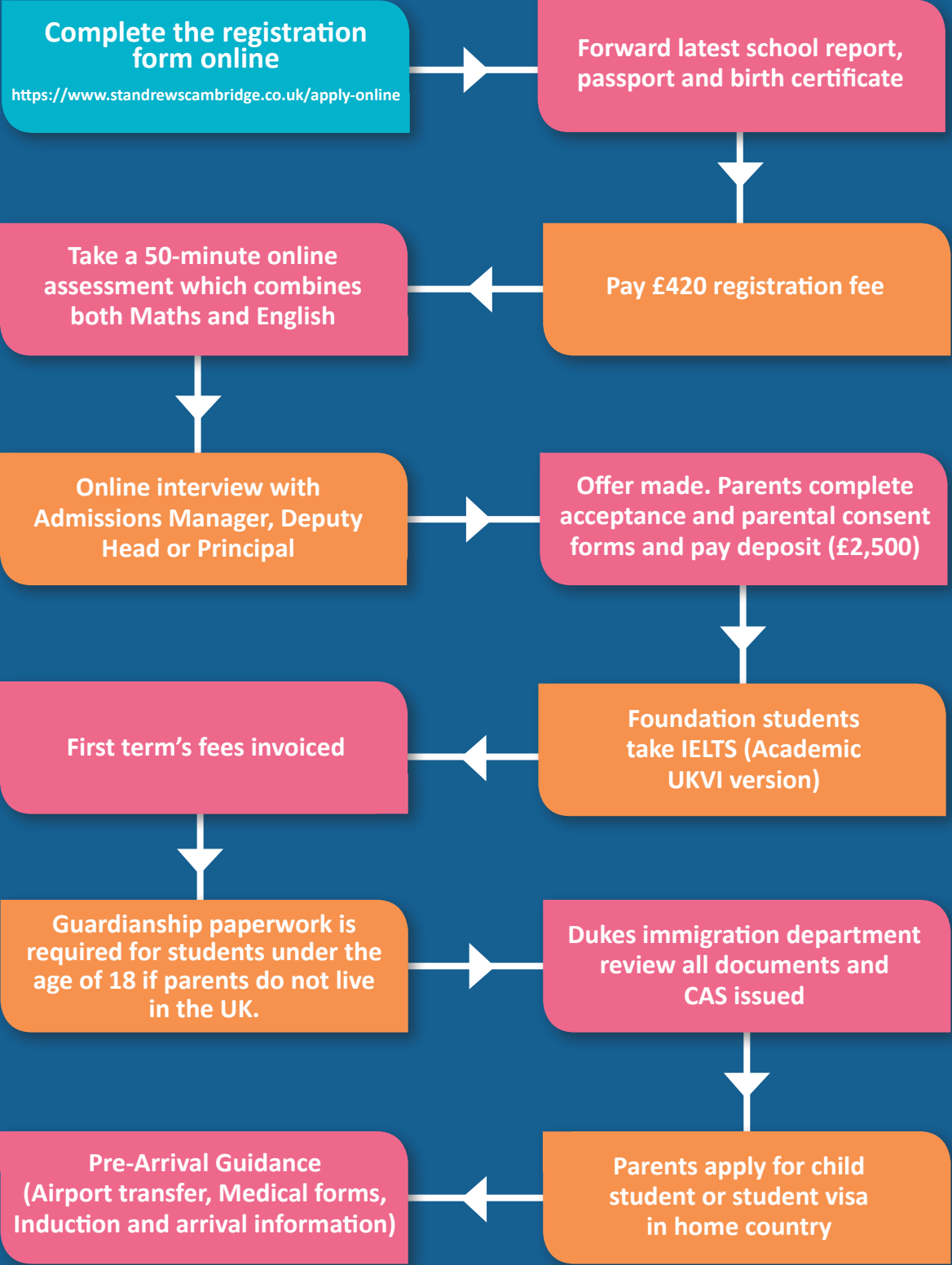

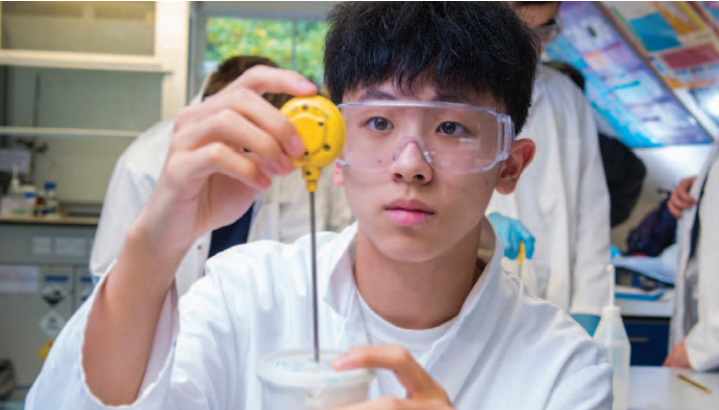
